Poor confident Charlie's Newspaper got wet and half the letters are missing. Can you put the right letters in for the poem he was reading to make sense?



## How Never-ending Stories Began



Cut out the pictures and match them to make a circle, square, triangle and star.





## Make your own dictionary on the fridge
